and Ty Casey in Junior Advanced, and Kacee Guedry in Junior


Beginner.

Brad Core, in his 2006 dragster, was a double bridesmaid for the weekend scoring a runnerup finish on each day. On Saturday, Core, from Crowley, Louisiana, fell to another area racer, Eli McGee from Gray, Louisiana. McGee cut a .029 reaction time and ran dead-on his 7.10 to cover Core's 7.64 on his 7.63 dial-in. In the Saturday semi-finals, McGee defeated Craig Liles who traveled over from Artesia, New Mexico and broke out with a 7.078 on a 7.08 dial-in, while Core took advantage of a bye-run to make it to his first of two final rounds that weekend.

In the Sunday Top Dragster Eliminator, Nick Brener, from Madisonville, Louisiana, made it to the finals with a 7.23 ET pass in a semi-final bye run. Brenner took the win over Brad Core in the finals, as Core broke out this time with a 7.63 pass on his 7.64 dial, and Brenner ran a 7.204 on his 7.20 dial-in.

GOOD VIBRATIONS TOP SPORTSMAN

Top Sportsman was a weekend of tight reactions and red-lights that brought out very close fast doorslammer action. Russel Marr, from Forney, Texas, came out as the Saturday winner with his 2003 Cavalier over Ricky Vedros from Belle Rose, Louisiana. Vedros ran under his dial with his 632 powered Beretta while Marr got the Saturday win running a 7.48 on his 7.47 dial. Vedros won in the semi-finals against Cody James of Odessa, Texas, when James red-lighted away his chances to the

finals. Marr took on Leslie Dugas in the other half of the semis with Dugas, who hails from Grandview, Texas, slowing with problems and giving the easy win to Marr.

In Sunday's Top Sportsman action, Russell Marr continued his hot streak, getting his second win in as many Renegade division races to start 2014. Marr took on Kamron Wright from Odessa, Texas. Wright red-lighted in the finals, while Marr eased his pass while the win light flashed on the scoreboards. Wright made it to the finals via bye-run, while Marr had to take on Jerry Jordan from Longview, Texas. Jordan cut the tree just .009 too quick, to give the win to Marr and allowing him into his second final round appearance.


SUPER STOCK


David Latino had a dominating weekend in Super Stock as he got to the final round on Saturday and the semis in Sunday eliminations. Latino, from Donaldsonville, Louisiana, met up against Larry Stewart of Clinton, Mississippi in the Saturday finals. Stewart dialed-in at 9.69 with his SS/HA Nova and took the win over a red lighting Latino in his SS/GTDA Cobalt. Latino made it to the finals defeating Larry Cummings of Hammond, Louisiana in the semis, when Cummings turned on the red-light. Stewart got past DeWayne Custer of Nacogdoches, Texas in his SS/GTAA Camaro on the other side of the semi-final ladder.

The Sunday half of Super Stock action paired Mike Braswell from Santo, Texas, in his SS/AM Firebird against John Clegg out of Victoria, Texas. Even after Braswell turned on a -.007 red-light, Clegg ran it out with a 8.351 on a 8.35 dial for the Sunday win. Clegg had to take on Saturday finalist David Latino in the semifinals, while Braswell earned a bye into the final round. Clegg ran a deadly 8.361 on his 8.36 dial to cover Latino's 9.544 on a 9.53 dial-in. Looking at these 2 rounds of stats notes that Clegg ran an impressive .001 above his dial-in on both the semi and final round pairings.

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STOCK ELIMINATOR

While an impressive 25 car field filled the Super Stock class, it was the Stock Eliminator class that tested

all, with a 36 car roster in qualifying each day. The Saturday field ended with Jay Robinson from Santa Fe, Texas, meeting up with David Latino who had also dominated in the day's Super Stock ladders. Robinson dialed an 11.95 with his I/SA Nova, while Latino showed a 10.45 on his dial-in board. Robinson launched with a .008 reaction time on the green side of the 'tree, while Latino red-lighted the final away. In the semi-final pairings, Robinson got past PB Candies in the AAA/FIA entry, when Robinson cut a better light to run a 12.02 on a 11.95 dial over Candies 9.12 on a 9.10 dial-in. David Latino earned a bye into the final round.

Out of the Sunday stack, it was Jimmy Hidalgo Jr. from Donaldsonville, Louisiana, that took his C/FIA GTO to the top. Hidalgo Jr. ran against Slate Cummings from Hammond, Louisiana, in his A/FIA Corvette during the final round, Hidalgo Jr. dialed-in a 10.79, but Cummings red-lighted the final away. Hidalgo Jr. had a bye-run in the semis, while Cummings took on Billy Chiasson from Raceland, Louisiana in a double break-out pairing. Cummings broke out by less with a 10.22 on a 10.27 dial as Chiasson ran a 12.32 on his 12.38 dial.

QUICK ROD

In the category where 8.90 is king, the bids for the weekend crowns were very high. Shannon Brinkley scored the Saturday win over Vance Lakey. Brinkley, traveling in from Highlands, Texas, took his Corvette roadster to the winner's circle when Lakey, from Sylvester, Texas, cut a -.027 red-light. Lakey scored the bye run in the semi-finals, while Brinkley advanced by defeating Paul Kimble from Metairie, Louisiana. Kimble was another victim to the red-light bug of the day, cutting an ever so close -.001 reaction and giving the final round appearance to Brinkley.

The Sunday section of Quick Rod action paired Christopher Dodd from Double Oak, Texas against Tony Farmer from Midland, Texas. Tight starting line reaction times had both dragsters racing for the stripe; Dodd got there first with a 8.91 on the 8.90 index compared to Farmer's 8.86 breakout finish. In the semi-finals, Farmer won against Randy Simoneaux from Rayne, Louisiana. Both racers ran identical 8.915 passes, while the math showed Tony Farmer's starting line reaction of .009 gave him the win, advancing him into the finals. Christopher Dodd earned the bye run in the semis to make it to the finals.

SUPER ROD

Super Rod Eliminator saw only one green light in the late rounds as the final round paired Shannon Brinkley continuing his win streak, taking on Randy Phillips from West Monroe, Louisiana. Double red-lights gave the win to Brinkley who cut the lesser red with a -.002 to Brinkley's -.017 with his '92 Camaro. In a four car semifinal round, Phillips got past Jerry Pollard of Alvin, Texas in his '65 Mustang. Phillips won over Pollard with his

.011 reaction time and 9.96 pass to Pollard's 9.92. Brinkley took on Keith Rafferty of Lake Charles, Louisiana. Rafferty's -.005 redlight handed the final round appearance to Shannon Brinkley.

In the second day of Super Rod racing it was Shannon Brinkley once again in the Winner's circle, as the Highlands, Texas racer won in the finals, this time against Marcus Skipper from Transylvania, Louisiana, in his 1970 Chevy Nova, Skipper cut the better .002 light, but a double breakout handed the victory to Brinkley who ran a 9.892 on the 9.90 index. In the semis, Brinkley got past Wes Neely, who broke out compared to Brinkley's positive E.T of 9.917. On the other half of the semis, Skipper defeated Keith Rafferty in his second semi-final finish for the weekend. Rafferty, from Lake Charles, Louisiana, broke out trying to overcome Skipper's .004 reaction and 9.91 ET to his own 9.895 pass.

HOT ROD

Reggie Baudoin of Breaux Bridge, Louisiana, topped the Hot Rod category in Saturday's competition. Baudoin met up in the final round against Slate Cummings, who was another of the racers having a winning streak weekend. Cummings and Baudoin both broke out of the 10.90 index in the finals, with Cummings running a 10.85 to Baudoin's 10.84 pass. One round earlier, Baudoin got the win light via his bye-run, while Slate made it to the finals by defeating Mark Naron from West Monroe, Louisiana. Naron broke out with a 10.88 to Cumming's almost perfect 10.907.

The Sunday half of Hot Rod competition paired Texas racers Mike Frederick, from Beaumont, Texas, in his '63 Corvette beside Tony Jones from Gimer, Texas. Jones had the starting line reaction advantage, but Frederick made it to the finish line first, running a 10.901 to Jones' 10.93. In the semi-final round, Jones made it past Tommy Costales from Manuel, Texas in his 1966 Corvette. Jones again had the starting line advantage, but this time successfully used it for the win over Costales to gain entry into the finals.

JUNIOR DRAGSTER

State Capitol's Junior Dragster program brought out over 40 young competitors in their three classes. Junior Master class racing came down to a final round between Shallon Broussard from Carencro, Louisiana and Addison Lejeune from Lafayette, Louisiana. Lejeune could not quite run the number as Broussard got to the finish line first with a 7.97 on a 7.90 dial-in. In the Junior Advanced class, Jordan Broussard from Carencro, Louisiana faced down Mallory Bontrager from Wylie, Texas. Broussard took a big starting line reaction advantage to get the win with a 9.08 ET over Bontrager's 8.94 pass. In the finals of Junior Beginner racing, Kacee Guedry from Brusly, Louisiana, faced down Jacob Hickey from Poncatoula, Louisiana. The starting line again was the deciding factor as Guedry took her head start reaction and held off Hickey by running a 12.21 on her 12.10 dial-in.

In Sunday's Junior Master competition, Jackson Core was the champ. The Crowley, Louisiana racer took on Bryce Granier from Labadieville, Louisiana. Core took a starting line reaction advantage to hold off Granier. Grainer ran a 7.94 on his 7.90 dial-in compared to Core's 7.94 on his 7.93 prediction. In the Junior Advanced category, Ty Casey from Van Vleck, Texas matched up with Aaron Jordon hailing from Fort Worth, Texas. Casey ran almost dead-on his 8.95 dial in to get the class win. Junior Beginner saw Kacee Guedry from Brusley, Louisiana, this time matched against Cole Walker of Denham Springs, Louisiana to bid for the trophies. Walker broke out with a 12.03 on his 12.08 dial to give the win to Guedry. -DRM


